**ZONBU'S ZONBOX DECLARED GREENEST COMPUTER FOR CONSUMERS,  
CERTIFIED AS FIRST CONSUMER DEVICE TO WIN  
GOLD-LEVEL CERTIFICATION FROM EPEAT**

Palo Alto, Calif., July 6/7/2007. Zonbu today announced that its upcoming desktop system, Zonbox, is the first computer for consumers to be rated "Gold" by the Electronic Product Environmental Assessment Tool (EPEAT).

More than 530 computers and monitors have been rated by EPEAT to date. Of these, only 5 have achieved "Gold" certification. Zonbu's Zonbox, currently in beta testing, is the only one designed for consumers. The rest were developed for office use.

"No one has developed a greener alternative for consumers," said Jeff Omelchuck, executive director of the Green Electronics Council, which manages the EPEAT program. "In addition to meeting or exceeding most of our environmental criteria, Zonbu's Zonbox consumes a fraction of the power of most desktops."

EPEAT helps people evaluate, compare and select products based on criteria under the following categories:

- Reduction or elimination of environmentally sensitive materials like cadmium, mercury and lead
- Design for end of life
- Product longevity/life cycle extension
- Energy conservation
- Corporate performance
- Packaging

Products meeting or exceeding each of the 23 required criteria are recognized as EPEAT Bronze. Products meeting all required criteria and at least 50 percent of the tool's optional criteria are recognized as EPEAT Silver. Products meeting all required criteria and at least 75 percent of the optional criteria are recognized as EPEAT Gold. (See <http://www.epeat.net/Criteria.aspx> for more details on EPEAT criteria.)

According to Gregoire Gentil, Zonbu's strategy for having a positive impact on the environment goes beyond meeting stringent environmental standards. "It is not enough to be green," said Gregoire Gentil. "We want to provide a better consumer experience and better value, too."

Zonbu pricing will start at \$99 plus a monthly subscription plan. This includes 20 best-of-breed software applications, unlimited tech support online, generous storage, constant data back up and syncing, free replacement of the Zonbox should problems arise (which will be automatically reconfigured to your previous personal settings) and access to personal data and applications from any Internet-connected device.

"We don't want anyone to have to worry about viruses, security, data loss or any of the hassles associated with traditional PCs, especially those who live in households with multiple computers," said Gentil. Homes shouldn't have to have IT administrators."

Zonbu's Zonbox is in the final stages of beta testing and will be available for purchase later this Summer.
